Our New Home

Samaritan House has a new home on Pacific Boulevard in San Mateo. The newly renovated building provides the space required to consolidate many Samaritan House core services at one location. The three-story, 17,000-square-foot facility was renovated under the direction of former Board Member Bob Fitzgerald, with coordination by Director of Program Operations Sharon Petersen. Designed by Dan Ionescu Architects & Planners and constructed by Beals Martin, Inc., our new home provides a unified base to meet the challenges of caring for people in need.

Enjoying the new and modern home at Pacific Boulevard are Client Services, the Kitchen, and Pantry programs that were formerly at the aged and deteriorating modular units at 401 North Humboldt Street. The new building will also house the administration offices and the Clothes Closet, which were previously at 1511 and 1515 South Claremont Street. The Clothes Closet program is now transformed into the "Kids Closet," providing quality new and used clothing to children ages newborn to 18.

As Samaritan House moves forward, we honor our past and celebrate our future. The structures at 401 North Humboldt Street were always meant to be temporary. Twenty years later, temporary buildings finally turned to permanent. Those worn-out buildings are gone, but we took the compassionate spirit with us, happy to feed the hungry and continuing to care for those in need.
